

## **A Bill to Secure America First**

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **Section I:** All funding for any and all overseas military bases for FY2009 onwards is
3. hereby repealed. Congress shall not appropriate any funds for overseas military
4. purposes unless it has approved a declaration of war.
4. **Section II:** Public Law 107-243, otherwise known as the Joint Resolution to Authorize
5. the Use of Military Force against Iraq Resolution of 2002, is hereby repealed.
6. **Section III:** Public Law 107-40, otherwise known as the Joint Resolution to Authorize
7. the Use of Military Force against Terrorists of 2001, is hereby repealed.
8. **Section IV:** All U.S. Military personnel serving in foreign nations are to be returned to
9. U.S. territory, pursuant to Section 4 (a) (1) of the War Powers Act, within 270 days.
10. **Section V:** For each month served overseas in areas previously affected by Public
11. Laws 107-243 and 107-40, each serviceman or woman shall receive one additional
12. month's leave.
13. **Section VII:** This bill shall be enforced by the Department of Defense.
14. **Section VIII:** This bill shall come into effect 90 days after passage.
15. **Section IX:** All laws or portions of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared
16. null and void.

## **A Bill to Institute the Fair Tax System**

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS ASSEMBLED THAT:

1       **Section 1:** The United States shall institute the Fair Tax System.

2       **Section 2:** The Fair Tax System shall be defined as follows:

3           **A.** The current federal tax code shall be repealed

4           **B.** The only federal tax that shall be levied shall consist of a sales tax of  
5           twenty-five percent of the financial amount of all purchases made within  
6           the jurisdiction of the United States

7           **C.** The Census Bureau shall annually determine poverty thresholds, and  
8           each household in the United States shall receive at the beginning of each  
9           month a check for twenty-five percent of the monthly poverty threshold  
10          for its household type (to reimburse taxes on expenses below the  
11          threshold)

12          **D.** All agencies not necessary to the administration of the above shall be  
13          phased out under Congressional oversight

14       **Section 3:** The Department of the Treasury shall oversee the implementation of  
15       this legislation and ensure compliance with the national sales tax.

16       **Section 4:** This legislation shall take effect for fiscal year FY2009.

17       **Section 5:** Any and all laws in conflict with this bill shall be null and void upon  
18       this legislation taking effect.

The Department of Justice under Attorney General Nandy Whitefille has announced its decision to prosecute people for their activities on the social networking website MyFace. So far the creators of the groups “Kill Hillary Before She Kills Us,” “Al Qaeda Pwns,” and “Senga Man Ate My Babies” have been indicted. Whitefille states that these individuals pose a clear and present danger and intend to violate federal laws by committing violent crimes. She added the government must take action before they do.

Director of the NSA Mark Nearhigh revealed that the agency has been monitoring MyFace users’ activities for the purposes of uncovering possible terrorist attacks and has a list of suspected threats. Both Whitefille and Nearhigh claim their actions are legally appropriate. The first person up for trial is 18-year-old Gabrielle Whiney, creator of “Reich and Roll.”
