

A Bill to Openly Publish Genetic Information

1. *Be it enacted by the student congress here assembled that*
2. **Section 1** All those obtaining a medical license will additionally provide their
3. full genetic makeup to the Genetic Association of Information Network (GAIN).
4. **Section 2** If one wishing to obtain a medical license is unable to afford a full
5. genetic makeup, the costs will be furnished by the National Institute of Health
6. **Section 3** All of the genetic information will be made available to all individuals
7. holding a doctor's license. The name of each individual will be published along
8. with the genetic information.
9. **Section 4** This bill will take effect on the beginning of July 1 following the
10. passage of this bill.
11. **Section 5** Congress shall have the power to enforce this bill by appropriate
12. legislation.
